Based on the **Lundy model of child participation** and the **Reference Framework of Competences for Democratic Culture** (RFCDC), this course explores the four key elements of space, voice, audience, and influence. Participants will learn how to create safe spaces for student expression, empower student voices, ensure those voices reach decision-makers, and translate student input into meaningful change.

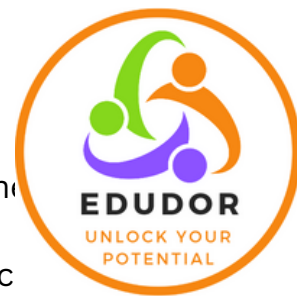
Through a combination of **interactive workshops**, case studies, and practical applications, participants will **develop strategies** they can immediately implement in their own school contexts. The course emphasizes **active learning**, **facilitated discussions**, and **peer coaching** to ensure that participants not only gain knowledge but also **develop the skills to apply this knowledge effectively**.

By the end of the course, participants will have **created action plans** for enhancing student participation in their schools, **developed tools** for assessing the impact of student voice initiatives, and built a **network of like-minded educators** committed to democratic education.

- Design and implement a student voice impact assessment tool
- Create an action plan for embedding democratic participation in their school culture
